As we pass our first census date for 2013, I am pleased to note the quality and strength of our student body. We currently have 18 students in the theological programme with 13 carrying a full time load. In addition we have numbers of students taking units for personal and ministry development and we pray this number increases throughout the year. The competence and work load of our faculty, of two full time and two part time teachers, is reflected in the fact that we are teaching 53 units in 24 different subject areas. Currently we have two students doing a Diploma of Theology, six doing a Bachelor of Theology, one doing a Graduate Diploma, four working on a Master of Arts, two doing a Master of Theology, one Master of Divinity and one student working on a Doctor of Ministry. This is again a reflection of the breadth of educational opportunities that is offered at NTC.

For the first time, a tour group of 15 students from Korea Nazarene University visited NTC. There were fifteen students in this group. They came to do a month long English cultural immersion course. All were impressed with the experience and with the quality of education. We hope to see this repeated many times. Our English school continues to develop with an increasing number of students from the community taking general English, TESOL, and IELTS programmes.

NTC continues to examine new ways of extending our academic reach and availability to the Church of the Nazarene, the broader theological academic

community and the community in which we are located.

Among the most exciting avenues available to us to extend the reach of our academic endeavours is our video conferencing facility. Almost every class we offer has students from throughout the field involved through video conference. Exciting!
